

# Gardens open May 3!

Beginning Wednesday, May 3, YOUR Gardens will be open Wednesday - Sunday from 11 am to 5 pm.

The Welcome Center, Garden Gift Shop, restrooms, and Trails will be open during these hours. We will once again open the Gardens on a donation basis for admission. Donation boxes will be placed throughout the Gardens and at trail heads to allow visitors to make a donation in lieu of admission.

**Please note:** Goodell Gardens & Homestead welcomes well-behaved, leashed, vaccinated, and licensed dogs on the trails, so long as they are under control and their handler cleans up after them. Tick preventative is highly recommended.

Because the Gardens are a living collection of plants, only ADA-protected service animals are allowed in the formal Gardens and at Goodell Events.

No pets are to be tethered or left in vehicles on Goodell property at any time.

## **Guided Tours & Trail Hikes**

Visit Goodell Gardens to see what is blooming!

We offer informal **guided garden tours** starting at **1 pm on Sundays** (except May 21 and Sept. 17) for members and other visitors of varying ages. Bring your curiosity and questions with you to learn more about many facets of horticulture. We will walk along the garden path at a relaxing pace. Tours last approx. 45 minutes

Hit the Trails with Education Coordinator Andrew for a in-depth tour of the expansive property behind the gardens. Observe nature, learn about the landscape, and get to know local plants, birds, and other wildlife. Guided trail hikes will take place 10 am - noon Saturdays May 27, July 22, and Sept. 23.

Admission is free, but donations are appreciated.
